Questions

1. What do we discern the Anglican presence in our area should be? (In other words, what is the vision for new life?)
 - a. What are the caring ministries that are vital for maintaining community and our faith?
 - b. Who should we be in relationship with? Who do we need to engage in our community and beyond? What barriers or bridges do we need to consider (i.e. accessibility, visibility, and tradition/needed)?
 - c. What aspects of Anglican worship and traditions are important for us to continue? What is important to add to this?
 - d. How should we involve youth, support education ministries for children and adults and welcome new members?
2. How could such an Anglican presence in our area be sustained?
 - a. What staff do we need (clergy and lay persons' expertise) to carry out our discerned ministries?
 - b. What physical facilities (in terms of functionality) are needed to support our discerned ministries and activities? How does this differ from current reality?
 - c. What additional resources are needed (e.g., number and characteristics of parishioners, level of steady income)?
